

Did you know: Anyone born after 1988 is required to have a Boating Safety Certificate issued by the DNR to legally operate a motorized boat or personal watercraft (PWC) on Wisconsin waters? In addition to it being the law, taking a boat safety class can save your life: four out of five people who die in boating accidents on Wisconsin's waters every year haven't had such formal training. Gain the safe boating techniques and knowledge that can keep you safe on the water.

The Door County Sail & Power Squadron has been serving area boaters as the premier source for public boating education in Door County since 1954. Club members are dedicated to promoting safe recreational boating for all Door County and surrounding community boaters. Door County Sail and Power Squadron members represent a broad cross section of boating interests that includes paddle, sail and power. Instructors are certified by the DNR, USPS "Instructor Development" & Boat Operators Certification Training to conduct boating and personal watercraft safety courses. Introductory classes are suitable for most ages and skill level beginning as early as age 12. We prepare new boaters for a safe experience on the water, and we make experienced boaters even better. All classes are led by certified boating safety instructors with advanced boating education credentials and years of experience on the water.

Students who successfully complete the "America's Boating Course" written exam will earn a DNR safe boating certificate. It is advised that students under the age of 15 be accompanied by a parent or guardian to insure successful completion of the class.
