All classes are led by certified boating safety instructors with advanced boating education credentials and years of experience on the water. Students that successfully complete the "America's Boating Course" written exam will earn a DNR safe boating certificate. Students under the age of 15 should be accompanied by a parent or guardian to insure successful completion of the class.

Course completion certificates normally qualify adult boat owner discounts through their respective insurance companies.
