



#### COMMANDER'S MESSAGE



As we head into December, a look back on what has made the Door County Sail & Power Squadron so rewarding seems appropriate. Blending District-10's theme of *Making a Splash! Fun for kids of all Ages* with our core USPS principles of Civic Service, Education and Fraternity, has allowed our Squadron and its' membership to remain innovative and energized throughout the 2011 Watch Year.



Our approach to Civic Service included a continued emphasis on boater safety and Vessel Safety Checks. We attempted a new approach for VSC's with Examiners assigned to various marina's. This approach met with mixed results and a realization that focused VSC dates, added to the assignment strategy, would drive increased boater volume as a result of more formal publicity of VSC's. We were successful in achieving 131 VSC's. We also see a need for additional Examiners within our Squadron and a program is being developed for 2012, using the USPS Course materials, to enroll and certify new Examiners into the VSC ranks.

Earlier this year, we participated in Safe Boating Week by focusing our resources on public awareness of the USPS and its' offerings. This was accomplished via publicized radio interviews where boater safety was discussed by our Executive Officer and boater education was discussed by our SEO and our seasoned ABC3 instructor. These broadcast interviews were later posted to both our Website and Facebook page.

In August, we again conducted a "Flare Shoot and Fire Extinguisher Training" for both our members and the public. Working with the local Coast Guard and the Sturgeon Bay Fire Department, this event was further enhanced by the availability of an *expired flare drop-off and disposal service*, courtesy of our VSC Chairman and the municipality of Sister Bay, in northern Door County. This event attracted over 30 participants.

Not surprisingly, education continued to be *the* key value driver within our Squadron. We have continued our strategy to grow Squadron membership and student participation in USPS courses and seminars through

free public seminar offerings and our bundled “Sail-Away Membership/Education” package. We have been successful in increasing both educational participation and membership through seminars and core courses.

A snap-shot of education offered throughout this year includes Engine Maintenance, Sail, Seamanship and ABC3 in early spring. Leveraging our Brunswick Initiative partner, Skipper Bud’s Quarterdeck Marina, we engaged 34 attendees at our Rules of the Road seminar in February. In June we ran the seminars Knots and Sail Trim and Rig Tuning. In July we ran the seminars Charts and Advanced Power Boat Handling. In August we ran the seminars Mariner’s Compass and Anchoring. September saw students engaged in Piloting and Advanced Piloting. The much anticipated Weather class was re-scheduled for early spring 2012. We were also successful in piloting a new, streamlined, approach to the ABC3 class for the Ephraim Yacht Club in mid-summer. Enhancement of this pilot is now being worked on within the education department for potential 2012 offerings. Additionally, our key ABC3 instructor gave a customized “Boating Safety” presentation to the Door County Rotary Club in July. This well-received presentation included a discussion of the various DCS&PS education, on-water and civic programs available.

*Fraternity is synonymous with Fun!* We engaged our members and friends with a smorgasbord of social and on-the-water opportunities. Some of our events included a “Fitting Out” dinner meeting in May which included a well-attended “Las Vegas Casino Night” and included *action at the tables*, food, drink and a late evening, live auction. June saw an early summer picnic at the Old Stone Quarry County Park where good food and a *very* competitive baseball game commenced and was subsequently chronicled on our Facebook page. July saw a contingent of seven Squadron boats embark to North Eastern Lake Michigan for a lively, two-week cruise to seven ports. This continues to be a great way to get to know your fellow members, learn new skills and have fun in the process.

Early August witnessed the successful execution of the USPS District-10 Summer Rendezvous celebration, “*The Big Easy by the Bay*,” in Door County. This event attracted over 100 attendees who enjoyed – amongst other things – a sunset dinner cruise on the Harbor Lady, tours of the Coast Guard Cutter Mobil Bay, participation in the Maritime Museum’s Wooden Boat Show, an art walk, a marina dock walk as well as a Saturday evening dinner complete with live Dixieland jazz, a silent auction and fireworks. All good things come to an end and on Sunday, our guests and friends were treated to a hot breakfast *cooked to order* by the DCS&PS “Omelet

Slingers.”

In late August we conducted our *annual* DCS&PS cruise and rendezvous to Menominee, MI where either boat or “land-yacht” was sufficient to allow a large contingent of Squadron members, intent on good food, games, puzzles and hearty conversation, to party for the week-end and begin “lay-up” planning. September ushered in our annual Shrimp and Corn Boil, complete with croquet, football, great member desserts and plenty of time for socializing and greeting new members. October saw us well into lay-up with many of our boats “on the hard” so there was more than enough time for our annual “Lay-up” dinner meeting which included new member induction and a summary presentation of the summers’ North Eastern Lake Michigan cruise.

As Commander of the DCS&PS, it gives me great pleasure to also highlight additional activities that have engaged our Bridge and our members, generating great debate and successful ideation. We continued to drive *Distinction in Journalism* with our monthly publication The Door Scuttlebutt and have ensured that both our Website and our Facebook page reflect that excellence and diversity of thought. Speaking of our Website, we passed the national Website audit with a flurry of commendations which energized us to take on initiation of a Facebook page as well. All three of these communication vehicles are done with best-practice excellence and are linked on our Website. Additionally, we have reached out into the community, via the quarterly publication Door County Living magazine, to broaden public awareness of our Squadron and USPS. This award-winning, quarterly, entertainment magazine is preparing a feature article on the DCS&PS for its’ May, 2012 issue.

Your Bridge recently took on the daunting task of upgrading our Squadron By-laws which have, thanks to our Executive Officer, received preliminary approval from the National Committee on Rules. Your Bridge has a hopeful eye on publication in 2012. The operating budget continues to be in great shape, thanks to the watchful eye of our dedicated Treasurer. We also have pursued various grants throughout the year. When successful, these grants are great supplements to our treasury and yield USPS public relations’ opportunities as well.

The Brunswick Initiative has garnered notable traction as evidenced by our relationship with “Skipper Bud’s Quarterdeck Marina.” We have our USPS materials available and on display, we have been given access to brokerage boats, we conduct our public seminars in their facility and their sales manager is a current, and

supportive, member of our Squadron. This relationship continues to be healthy and in a “build-up mode.”

Some of our program changes, such as the “assigned marina” Vessel Safety Checks, did not yield the anticipated results but have positioned us for innovative and synergistic approaches to VSC’s in 2012. Other program changes, such as our approach to ABC3 in Northern Door County, have opened our eyes to the possibilities of education expansion and successful competition with other Boater Safety offerings.

We have endured some challenges in member retention, yet we have posted net membership *gains* with enthusiastic *new* members and tenured *current* members. This is, in no small part, due to our approach to core USPS education offerings *and* our approach to public USPS seminars, innovative social events and exciting cruising venues. We continued our “Coffee with the Commander” program for new members, expanding it to include *both* the in-coming *and* the current Commanders.

So, with much good will and help from our membership, it would appear that “the organizational seas” are what a successful captain would anticipate and hope for. For our Door County Sail & Power Squadron, now heading into the Holiday Season, 2011 has been a successful, healthy and energizing year. Thank you.



#### **FROM THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER**

When I was asked by the nominating committee to consider running for Commander, I was surprised. I had expected it someday, but not for at least another year.
