Expired flares were collected for disposal, many expired aerials were fired off, and practice with hand held flares was demonstrated and engaged in by a number of members and non-members.

The Fire Extinguished Drill was held under the guidance of the Sturgeon Bay Fire Department and with the support of Van's Fire and Safety business in Green Bay who donated six fire extinguishers. Each person who practiced was coached by members of the Fire Department as they blanketed fires set in a pan of water through which propane was bubbled.

Thanks go to the Coast Guard personnel, and to the men of the SBFD for their help in this National Safe Boating Week activity. As always, we appreciate the support of Van's and to our friend Tom Fox who will arrange for flare disposal. Attached are a few of the photos obtained.

From the WebMaster.....

I have been updating the public computer at Quarterdeck recently.

So far I installed the Coastal Explorer's, Viewer Edition. It is a basic chart viewer and route planning tool that is available free of charge from Rose Point Navigation Systems. CEVE lets you view NOAA RNC® raster charts and plan routes. This is the Viewer that the Power Squadron is promoting instead of the Maptech Viewer from the past. On Windows 7 the Maptech viewer can only be run in the administrator account therefore it is not suitable for use on a public computer.

I also installed Sea Clear as it is a popular, totally free viewer/chart plotter for PC's. It is popular among sailors in Yahoo's Great Lakes group and I used it to make some charts in the past.

I have been using Memory Map Navigator (the non-free version) and I like it the best as it is good on smart phone's, PDA's, PC's, and iPad's. I have found that the demo version, which is free, operates very nicely on laptops and desktops. I think there are probably some users that would prefer Memory Map so I also installed that demo version on the QD lounge computer.

If you come by, check it out, you may find one of these programs to your liking.
