




Our summer **Seminar Series** concluded with our sixth seminar: **Trailering Your Boat** this past Saturday 25 August. Nearly 50 students attended our seminars this summer. I consider that commendable. My sincere thanks go out to our instructors: Alan Wentworth, John Reichmann, John Hermann and Steve Rank.

Seamanship is scheduled to start 18 September at NWTC classroom 103 at 1900. To date we have 7 students registered. Two of our students came to us through our recently promoted SailAway package. Thanks go out to Paul King our instructor. We have room for more. Last call! Join us.

Weather with Alan Wentworth teaching to classrooms in Green Bay and Sturgeon Bay simultaneously will resume 12 September.

Last month I asked ASEO Steve Rank to assume responsibility for the Inland and Coastal Navigator levels in the BOC program. Steve's communication went out to all eligible candidates on 1 August. We have about six candidates spread over the two levels, who have expressed an interest in on-the-water training. I'm excited to let you know; we are getting the USPS "Water Trainer". So: What's the Water Trainer? 'Water Trainer' is a 20ft Boston Whaler Dauntless powered by a 200hp Mercury outboard. It travels about the country (pony express style) on its custom trailer pulled by a Ford F150 pickup. 'Water Trainer' is funded by a grant to USPS to provide a facility for On-The-Water training.

I will be picking up the Water Trainer in Minnesota on 26 September and passing it on to Peoria, IL, late 29 Sept. It will be available for OTW training in Door County 27, 28 & 29 September. Come join us. We have room for a few more. Call Steve



Automated Radio Check (ARC): Last month I reported that Sea Tow has created a network of radio stations to allow boaters to do “radio checks” without using VHF Ch 16. Dial up Channel 28 and key your mike. You will receive a pre-check message that identifies DCMM as the host. Your radio check message will be played back to you, followed by a PSA promoting the Door County Sail & Power Squadron. There are 8 different PSAs ranging from Safe Boating Courses to Life Jackets to VSCs. Sea Tow is close to releasing the following announcement (in part). What a great promotion for DCS&PS and our preferred partner; the Door County Maritime Museum!!

Boaters in the Sturgeon Bay Shipping Canal and as far west as 5 miles out into the waters of Green Bay and 5 miles or more to the east out into the waters of Lake Michigan can take advantage of this vital boating safety service free of charge by calling Channel 28 on their VHF radio.”
