

VESSEL SAFETY CHECK PROGRAM

The VSC program for 2012 concludes in December. My thanks to our VSEs for their efforts to promote safe boating by providing free vessel safety checks to the public. This is an important and very visible service to a major boating community here in Door County.

All of our VSEs contributed to our total of 138 completed VSCs. Every squadron seems to have an outstanding examiner and Bill Galligan is ours, having submitted 42 VSCs. Door County lost two examiners with high numbers in recent years. We are very happy to have added Mike Morrison this year and, recently, new member Bob Snyder from Green Bay who brought his VSCs to our squadron.
