





Scuttlebutt May Quiz Answer


“Zulu” is short for “Zulu time,” which is used by the military and in navigation generally as a term for Universal Coordinated Time (UTC).

On 15 May at 2:00 p.m. in Door County, what will be the Zulu time?

Answer: In October 1884 the Greenwich Meridian was selected by delegates (41 delegates representing 25 nations) to the International Meridian Conference held in Washington, D.C. to be the common zero of longitude and standard of time reckoning throughout the world.

The coordinated universal time (UTC) at the Greenwich Meridian is 6 time zones east of Door County. However, due to Daylight Saving Time, Door County is one hour later. Therefore, at 2:00 p.m. (in May), UTC—or “Zulu”-time is 7:00 p.m., or 1900.
