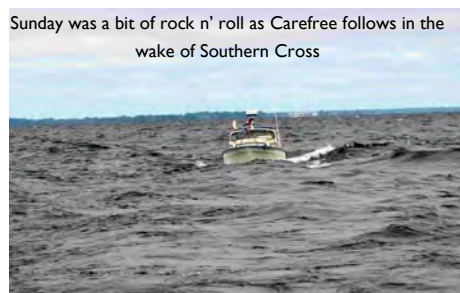

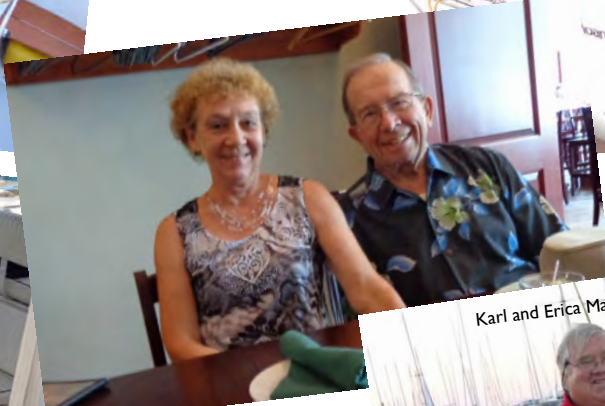

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

Vessel safety checks have continued apace through the end of August, our VSEs having completed 207 inspections. Twenty one boats, or 10%, failed to pass inspection. Navigation lights, dirty flame arrestors on gasoline engines, and uncovered negative battery terminals (Wisconsin regulation) were the most common failures. The national VSC season ends in November. Here, in the northern Great Lakes, not many VSCs will likely be completed after Labor Day. At this late date Door County leads D-10 squadrons in completed inspections, accounting for 20% of the district total, our best season thus far. The November Scuttlebutt will have a wrap up report that covers the national picture.

For the vessel safety inspection, VHF radios are not required safety equipment, but are to be recommended and discussed, especially with the emphasis now placed on Distress Signal Calling (Rescue 21). All of our captains appreciate the importance of the VHF radio. P/C Bob DeNoto reported that our installation of the Sea Tow Automated Radio Check is now working effectively throughout most of the local cruising area.

Door County Sail and Power Squadron once again participated in the Sister Bay Festival 30 August. Rain resulted in fewer visitors at our tent, which was located midway on the boardwalk in front of the boat slips. A fair number of folks stopped by during the "drippy" morning, but a serious rain curtailed traffic. A heavy downpour shut down traffic for the afternoon.

It's important to have a squadron presence at boat shows and waterfront festivals. The squadron gets visibility, meets the public, hands out literature and usually conducts some VSCs.

My sincere thanks to our members who participated in Sister Bay: Cynthia and Craig Weiss, Bob DeNoto, Bill Galligan and Lou Pasquesi.

Fred Hankwitz, P: 1940-2014

The weekend of 23 August, I skippered Carefree up to Washington Island to attend the 3rd annual Death's Door Barbecue, which is a Kansas City BBQ sanctioned event. Fred Hankwitz was one of the original drivers of this event. He and a few others got it started in 2012. We lost Fred, 30 July, at age 74. Fred was a 58 year member of USPS, a longtime member of the Door County Sail & Power Squadron and my dear friend. During my tenure as your Commander and Educational Officer, Fred was my go-to for all things "Island".

There are many fond memories I have of Fred: The day we presented him with his 50 year pin at Bay Pharmacy, the presentation he gave at our 2009 "Fitting-Out" dinner" at Mr.G's but most of all; the spring of 2012. We were making our first attempt at bringing the Boater's Safety Course to Washington Island. Bill Galligan was instructing in classroom 137 at the NWTC Campus in Sturgeon Bay. His presentation was being simulcast to a classroom at the Washington Island School. Fred coordinated all the needs associated with the Island class. My intent was to head up for the first class to kick off the course. Fred picked me up at the Ferry. We drove to his home where Lisa was preparing an early feast. I would be staying with them that evening and departing on an early Ferry the following morning.

Class was scheduled to start at 6:30. Fred and I arrived about 6:00 in anticipation of registering the students. Two members of the local Coast Guard Auxiliary joined us. Much to our disappointment, about an hour passed and no Island students showed. Nine students regis-

tered in Sturgeon Bay. Fred and I returned to his home for a delightful evening of conversation; filled with our many stories.

The following morning we departed for an early Ferry. Fred was going off island as well. But first a stop at the "Red Cup" for coffee! Fred and I joined the large round table of locals which included the pastor, the police chief, the attorney and a marina operator. We queried our table members about last evening's disappointment and lack of students. Their universal response was: we were attempting to charge too much (\$40). Think about the beauty of this: A small connected, community providing immediate valuable feedback. The ferry ride back is another story. With

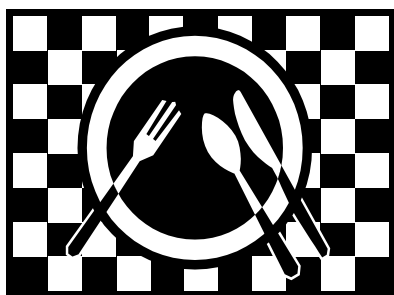
Fred being a retired Captain of the Ferry Line, I got to ride in the wheel house: Way Cool! How endearing this total experience was for me.

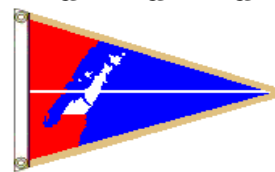

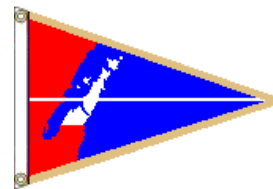
