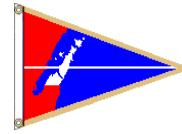

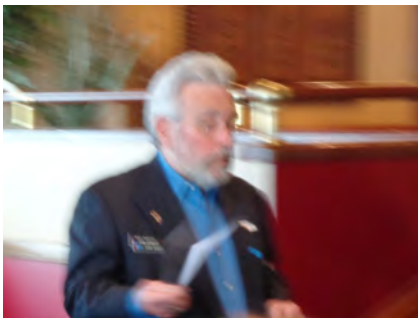

## FROM YOUR EDUCATION OFFICER

Hello Cruisers,

I've decided what I want to give up for Lent -----WINTER! Last year we had the Polar Vortex while this year they call it the Siberian Express. To paraphrase Shakespeare, "A vortex by any other name would feel just as cold. Out! Out! Damn Vortex!". Actually, things could be much worse. We could be in Boston and buried under record snowfalls topping 100 inches – or upper Michigan, which is annually blanketed under that much snow or more. Since I usually see the silver lining in things, I hope the cold weather we have experienced will help to keep the evaporation rate low and the lake water level high as a consequence. Five students are taking Navigation under the superlative leadership of Alan Wentworth using the Go-To-Meeting format, allowing students from different parts of the country to participate. This bodes well as a model we can use to teach future courses to a wider audience. This is a remarkable number of students taking Navigation for our or any squadron.

Four students are taking Junior Navigation under the expert teaching of John Welch in a classroom format at NWTC. I am thrilled at the large number of students taking N and JN. When I look at roster membership lists for ours and many other squadrons, I am led to the conclusion that the highest grade most often attained by members is Advanced Pilot. To see this many people moving up in navigational skills is absolutely thrilling to me. I encourage all of our members to consider upping their navigational skills as part of an ongoing process of being the best boaters you can be. Challenge yourselves. You won't regret it.

Finally we will be offering Electronic Navigation under Captain Chuck Stone starting 2 April at NWTC. This course will be focused on using your electronic equipment to supplement your navigational skills. Many people have equipment aboard their boats for navigation, but are not well versed in using that equipment to its best advantage. This is the Canadian version to be coupled with the first two parts of Marine Electronics we also offer. I hope many of you will join Chuck for this course.

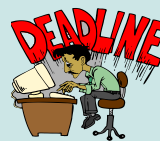

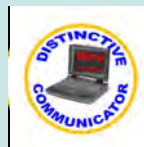

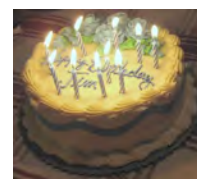
